Drugs are said to be abused when they are used for purpose other than that which was intended. Drug dependence occurs when a user is unable to live without it. A person who highly depends on drugs is likely to be drug addict. When we talk of drug abuse we refer to the abuse of marijuana, heroin, cocaine and mandrax. Many young people are drug addicts because they are influenced by their peers.

Drugs affects people in many ways. First, they are costly as people spend much money on them. People become affected economically when they cannot live without using drugs and therefore they become drugs victims. Also, the drug addict cannot be productive.

Secondly, drugs affect user’s health in that they can affect the human brain and body in ways that last longer after the person has stopped taking them. The part of the brain which is affected is the one that deals with movement, emotion, cognition, motivation and feeling of pleasure.

Thirdly, people who use drugs are likely to be infected with HIV/AIDS because of sharing syringes.

Fourthly, people who use drugs are likely to be affected socially because drugs lead to family violence and breakup. Also drug abusers may resort to crimes so as to get money for drugs.

Drug addicts need to be treated. One may get treatment while living at home or may be taken to the rehabilitation centers. Before an individual get treated she/he needs to be counseled.
